- salt and pepper

Gently remove the yolks from the eggs and place them in a medium sized bowl. Mash the yolks, and gradually add the other ingredients and blend well.

Carefully spoon the mixture back into the hollowed whites. Sprinkle a little paprika on the top for added color and zest.

Recipe

INDIAN PUDDING

quart milk
tablespoons butter
cup cornmeal
eggs
cup sugar
tablespoon cinnamon
1/2 teaspoons ginger
teaspoon salt

1 cup molasses

Bring milk and butter to a boil. Add cornmeal and stir constantly until smooth, well blended, and slightly thickened. Remove from stove; add eggs, sugar, salt, cinnamon, ginger, and molasses. Mix well together and put into a baking dish about 2" deep. Cover with wax paper. Bake approximately one hour at 400 degrees in a pan of water or until wax paper can be lifted without pudding sticking to it. Serve hot with vanilla ice cream on top. Yield: 6. Cooking time: 45 minutes.



November 9th – Collapse of the Berlin Wall 1989

One of the symbols of this Cold War was the Berlin Wall, built in 1961, which separated the communist East Germany from the democratic West Germany. 60 MINUTE DINER ROLLS

cup milk
cup water
cup butter
cup sall-purpose flour
T sugar
tsp salt
pkgs. active dry yeast

**This is a parent participating project!

Combine milk, water and butter in a small saucepan. Heat over low heat until liquids are very warm to the touch, about 120 degrees. The butter does not need to melt completely. In a mixer bowl, place 3 cups of the flour, along with the remaining dry ingredients. Mix on low speed until well blended. Gradually add the warm milk mixture. Mix until well blended.

Gradually begin adding the remaining 1 to 2 cups of flour, 1/2 cup at a time, until the dough is firm, clings to the hook, and cleans the sides of the bowl. Turn out onto counter top and knead a few times. Place in a large greased bowl and allow to rise in a warm place for 20 minutes. Turn out, and divide into rolls or loaves, whichever you choose. Place bread in a warm place and allow to rise for another 20-30 minutes. Bake in a 425-degree oven for 10-12 minutes or until golden brown. Brush with butter while still warm to produce a nice soft crust.

November 18th Mickey Mouse's Birthday

In 1928, the film "Steamboat Willie" was released. This is considered to be Mickey Mouse's "birthday". Walt Disney, the creator of Mickey Mouse, is generally considered to be one of the greatest illustrated filmmakers. Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation, or any nation, so conceived, and so dedicated, can long endure. We are met here on a great battlefield of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of it as a final resting place for those who here gave their lives that that nation might live. It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do this.

But in a larger sense we can not dedicate -- we can not consecrate -- we can not hallow this ground. The brave men, living and dead, who struggled, here, have consecrated it far above our poor power to add or detract. The world will little note, nor long remember, what we say here, but can never forget what they did here. It is for us, the living, rather to be dedicated here to the unfinished work which they have, thus far, so nobly carried on. It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us -- that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to that cause for which they here gave the last full measure of devotion -- that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain; that this nation shall have a new birth of freedom; and that this government of the people, by the people, for the people, shall not perish from the earth.
